

INVASIVE BRUSH FOCUS AREAS WARBLER RIDGE



Bush Honeysuckle: Our most common woodland invader. Look for teardrop-shaped opposite leaves.



Autumn Olive: Found in open areas with more sunlight. Leaves have silvery undersides.



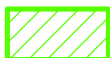
European Privet: Dense and bushy with long, narrow opposite leaves. White flower clusters in mid-June followed by blue-black berries.



Multiflora Rose: Long thorny arching stems. Compound leaves have hairy-looking fringe at bases.
